
1. LINKAGES AND SYNERGIES WITH OTHER INTERNATIONAL FORA

- Strong signals of support, including in **Joint Ministerial Statement** at CEM15 and **G20 Ministerial Outcome Statement** from Energy Transitions Ministerial Meeting
- CEM **workstreams have provided ready-made action coalitions** that can deliver priorities identified in other fora such as G20, G7, COP, APEC etc – e.g. work on power sector, future fuels and people-centred transitions.



2. CEM AS A TOOL TO DELIVER ON CEM MEMBER PRIORITIES

- Fundamental importance of **CEM's ability to adapt and respond to CEM member priorities** – both domestic and international – and to **translate ambition into action and results**





DELIVER: CEM's role as an action-oriented, implementation platform





REPRESENT: Ensure CEM's relevance in different regions, including EMDEs

Recognising that **CEM is a global platform** with a diverse membership, **Ministers noted the value of ensuring that the CEM and its value proposition is relevant in different regions**, including EMDEs. This builds on the strategic dialogues at the 2024 CEM Senior Officials' Meeting in Bali, Indonesia and CEM15 Ministerial in Foz do Iguacu, Brazil.

- ✓ Regular exchanges between CEM members, workstreams, partners and the Secretariat to **communicate specific member needs and regional challenges/opportunities**

IMPACT

On the ground implementation, by addressing barriers to deployment



- ✓ Identify opportunities to **tailor CEM's work to a specific region in order to maximise impact**, e.g. through regional partnerships, special standalone projects

INSPIRATION

Exchange of best practice, lessons learned, global commitments and pledges




- ✓ Work with members and partners to **apply and emulate CEM's work in different regions**, e.g. at regional events; facilitate **participation of interested non-CEM members** in relevant workstreams



MOBILISE: Maintain and develop partnerships within the CEM community
